

TEERAGER, WHICH LIST IS YOUR NAME ON? by Greg Dowdy

At this time of year, there is much attention given to a particular list. It is usually divided into "Naughty" and "Nice." There is one list on which most people WANT their name (especially if they want a good Christmas gift) and one list on which most people DON'T WANT their name. There is another list of names. As a matter of fact, this list is the most important list of all time. Your eternity is based upon which list your name is found. Allow me to illustrate it this way. This past spring, we took a family trip to an amazing exhibition. The TITANIC exhibition, to be exact. Upon entering, each person is given a ticket with the name of an individual and details of that individual. That name is the name of a person on board that "unsinkable" ship on its maiden voyage. Like most people, I forgot about that ticket as I enjoyed taking a "tour" of the ship (which was really awesome!). At the conclusion of the tour, there was a large wall. It had two lists of names; there was a long list, and there was a short list. Next to each name was one of four designations: first class, second class, third class, and crew. But no matter what your class, your name ultimately appears on one of those two lists, which are under one of two headings: "Saved"..."Lost." Tragically, the short list is the one that says "saved." The long list is the names of the "lost." At the end of the exhibit, everyone is looking all over the list for their name to see if he or she survived the tragedy that took place 100 years ago. Fortunately, I survived!

As you read the Bible, you begin to realize that all of humanity is divided into those same two lists: "SAVED" and "LOST." There's no third list. You're on one or the other. The Bible says in John 3:36 that, "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him." Young person, either you have everlasting life, or you don't. Either you are saved, or you're lost. I am so thankful that when I was eleven years of age, my name was changed from the "LOST" list to the "SAVED" list! Teenager, make sure your name is on the "SAVED" list. Make sure that you have trusted Christ as your personal Saviour. We celebrate a baby in a manger, but Jesus came to die in your place.

"To preach the gospel in the **REGIONS BEYOND**" II Corinthians 10:16

Over the last few months we have had two missionaries who were serving abroad and now have returned home. Both missionaries and their families are now serving in local churches here in the states. With that being said, I want you to pray about adding two additional missionaries prior to our March for Missions. We are contacted weekly by missionaries who are requesting support, and, certainly, there is a great need around the world. Over the next few weeks, our Regions Beyond Directors will be reviewing missionaries who are worthy of support and prayerfully make a decision. We are also in the process of scheduling for next year's missions' month. March for Missions will begin on Sunday, March 4, 2012 and conclude with our Missions' Banquet on Sunday evening, March 25. Dr. James Ray, former Director of B.I.M.I., will be our guest speaker.

It is our prayer that God will continue to challenge our hearts in the area of world evangelism. The church has been given a great responsibility by the Lord Jesus Christ. The Great Commission is repeated by the Lord four times. However, the one that is most familiar is Matthew 28:18-20, "And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." Here we see clearly the task of the local church is to evangelize the lost, equip the believers, and to establish churches. Therefore, the emphasis of missions is to evangelize, to establish, and to equip! We are grateful for the privilege we have to support missionaries and realize the responsibility that comes with the opportunity. May we be faithful to support our missionaries through our prayers, financial support, encouragement, and our willingness to be obedient to the Great Commission here in our Jerusalem! Exciting Update From Another branberry!

We are privileged to support Nathan and Sheila Snode, church planters to

Cranberry, PA. Opening services at the Lifeway Baptist Church in April of 2012. Lifeway Baptist Church is a church plant of Harvest Baptist Church in Natrona Heights, PA. The Snode family is working with Bro. Earl Jessup and Baptist Church Planting Ministries. This report is from BCPM Assistant Director, Jeremy Rowland.

"Recently, I was on a trip to Cranberry, PA, to help Pastor Nathan Snode find a meeting place for an upcoming church plant in the spring of 2012. Cranberry is located just north of Pittsburg and is thriving with new homes and businesses. It would be difficult to find a meeting place since almost the whole town is new and real estate is very expensive. As we started out, we asked God to provide clear direction and open the door to find a place. There were not a lot of meeting places available and the few that were came with a price that was unaffordable. As we drove past a strip mall next to a large fitness center, we noticed a store front for lease. We stopped and called the owner who happened to be next door in the fitness center. He met us and asked what we needed the space for.

"When we mentioned a new Baptist church, he said with a pleasantly surprised look, 'Oh really.' He told us that this was exciting news and that he had been praying for over a year that God would send someone to start a conservative Baptist church in Cranberry. He then commented that he had something better than the store front next door in the fitness center. Come to find out, he built and owned both buildings and would be glad to share part of the fitness center for the new church. He took us next door and showed a nice meeting room, separate class room, and full nursery. I believe the owner was more excited than we were, and he even mentioned that he and his wife were praying about donating the whole building to a new church! Brother Snode and I walked away praising God and saying 'Only God could do this.' This is just another reminder that with God 'all things are possible.' God will provide for any church in any situation if we will simply seek Him."



The Lord's work is moving forward in Hinton! Little by little and step by step, we are seeing that our labor for Him is not in vain! Wonderful things have been taking place in His little flock in the foothills of the Canadian Rockies. We are excited to be ministering in the local seniors' home. On every third Sunday, we have a Bible-preaching, hymn-singing church service at the Mountain View Extended Care Facility. Also,

Hinton Baptist Church held its first baptismal service on September 11. Although the day was overcast, drizzling rain, and quite cool (+9C), four believers followed Christ in obedience in baptism. Praise the Lord!

Our application for permanent residence has finally been mailed. We were praying that the Lord would provide the funds necessary, and He did! Now, it is a matter of waiting for the government to approve our application, and then passing a physical exam.

We do covet your continued prayers. Kristy has had continued trouble with her lower back, with no answers or fixes from the doctors. Thank you for helping us be here. His work is moving forward. He is giving increases. Your labour...praying and giving...are not in vain!

While I was at the airport in Beijing, China, I met a man from Nigeria. He asked me what I was doing going to Mongolia. My response was that I was a Missionary there. He asked me what religion. I said, "Baptist." He said, "I have never understood Christianity." After we received our boarding passes, I asked him if he would like me to explain Christianity to him. He



said that would be good. We found a coffee shop, sat down, and ordered coffee. I took my Bible out and began to show him the Romans Road and explained that Jesus died for his sins and by accepting Him he could have a home in Heaven. I asked him if he understood. He responded, "Yes." "Would you like to except Jesus as you Saviour?" And again he responded, "Yes." We bowed our heads and he asked Jesus into his heart!

What an experience to be able to lead someone to the Lord in public in Communist China. He only needed someone to explain Jesus to him. Acts 8:35 says, "Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus." The world needs a clean presentation of Jesus!

UPDATE FROM TRAVIS MCHUGH, B.A.T.A. Missionary

We have had a great year of helping churches, distributing gospel literature door to door, and seeing souls come to Christ. We were able to help 11 churches this year. Our labors included pulpit supply, organizing campaigns to distribute door bags (filled with church information, tracts, and the word of God), soul winning, grounds clean up & repairs, church camps, church planting, strengthening campaigns, revival meetings, and Vacation Bible School. We have seen 11,500 door bags distributed up and down the east coast, in six states, with the majority of those doors being knocked. Every home received the gospel and we saw



over 50 people come to Christ this year. We would like to give praise to God first and then to all those that helped to make 2011 such a great work for our Lord Jesus Christ! Our family is grateful to the Lord for the opportunity we have to serve in this ministry! Thank you for your financial support and prayers!

ATHENS, OHIO CHURCH PLANT UPDATE, Pastor Troy Cline

Praise the Lord for the great things He has done in Athens, Ohio! The first week of December will make Bible Truth Baptist Church two months old. Our services have averaged about 20 on Sunday morning and 10 in the evening and mid-week services. Praise the Lord; we have had 4 people come to Christ and are now making preparations for a baptism service!

During our first Sunday service, we had a man saved. He and his family are now coming to the services and are excited about what is happening. Also, in that same service there was a young man who is very involved in Campus Crusade for Christ. He watched as the gospel was preached and that man came forward to be saved. This young man has been in Athens attending Ohio University for a couple years and tells me he has not found a church that is "Christ centered" where a person can come and be saved. He not only has been coming to the services but has brought friends with him.

Many churches came and helped with the John/Romans distribution in September. A total of 400 folks participated in the four weeks of distributing over 32,000 pieces of gospel literature. We are still seeing fruit from this amazing work. Still today as I go door to door I often meet someone who remembers receiving something from our church. Thank you all for your help and continued support here in Athens. As of this date we are at 50% of our support level. Our midweek service is on Thursday nights, therefore I am still available for meetings on Wednesdays to present this ministry.
